Elementary School Principal Job Description

Colegio Roosevelt is a dynamic international American school community located in Lima, Peru, and includes an overall student community of over 1600 students. In 2024-25, approximately half of these students are enrolled in the early years and elementary grade levels (EC3 - 5th Grade) overseen by the Elementary Principal.

The Elementary School Principal is assisted by 3 associate principals and other learning leaders who include learning specialists, counselors, EAL instructors, and specialists in Spanish, Art, Music, PE, Aquatics, Library, and Technology, as well as a very talented staff of teachers and teaching assistants. The Elementary School Division serves early childhood (3-year-olds) through to grade 5. The school curriculum and instructional practices are uniquely designed with subject-specific international standards that comprise the Roosevelt Curriculum and are intended to serve as the foundational program that bridges into the Middle School division. The Principal leads a staff that constantly explores and seeks best practices through the work with our global affiliations and international consultants. The current principal has experienced six successful years at Colegio Roosevelt, shaping a team of local and international educators to construct the learning foundations for nearly 800 students whom we refer to as our "condorsitos".

SCHOOL HISTORY

Colegio Roosevelt first opened its doors to students in 1946. Established by business persons in order to serve the needs of those in the community desiring a college preparatory American-style curriculum. Roosevelt has truly become one of the leading international schools in South America and the world. Roosevelt stays true to its American tradition and has changed over the years to support a population represented by international and local students.

Roosevelt is a non-profit school supported by tuition and fees. The school is accredited through Cognia, (formerly AdvancEd), the Peruvian Ministry of Education, and the International Baccalaureate Program. Roosevelt is a member of the American International School of the Americas (AMISA), the Tri-Association, AAIE and NAIS.

Colegio Roosevelt is guided by its Mission and Core Values, statements that strongly guide the educational efforts and the strategic objectives of academic life, student life, faculty life, and school life–impacting all stakeholders to be accountable to our school's belief statements and its foundations.

The arts scene is alive and thriving, with museums and galleries throughout the city. Peruvian cuisine is among the top in the world and makes for unlimited possibilities for dining and cooking.

Sprinkled throughout the city are ancient ruins from the time of the Incas. Lima is an international city with tourists from around the world who come to visit Peru's shores, deserts, mountains, and jungles. There is plenty of adventure for hikers, cyclists, runners, surfers and shoppers.

Our Early Childhood and Elementary School Condors are like no other. - What would cross-grade level/divisional learning look like? Sound like?
- How can we incorporate more "play", design, and problem-solving into the day? Where can we lean into the amazing environment of Lima/Peru/South America to incorporate more 'environment,' experience, and place into the curricular program while playing an active role in contribution and service to make their learning come alive and meaningful in their day-to-day routines?
- How are we reaching all learners and how do we demonstrate a learner's ability to think critically?
- How can we design learning to demonstrate and develop deep thinking?
- What differentiates our early childhood program from all others in ways that are mission-aligned and meaningful to the development of our youngest Condors?
- How do we build teams of teachers across grade levels and cultures to reach vertically and horizontally and embrace the value of shared purpose and collective contribution for inspiration?
- How do we demonstrate our core values day to day, and in the work of our students?
- How will we ensure our work is communicated cohesively and clearly to all members of our community?
- How will we celebrate learning at FDR?
- Where is there an opportunity to redesign learning time and space for innovation and new ideas in teaching and learning?

- have earned at least a Master's degree in related fields to education and leadership from an accredited college/university.
- have a proven track record and experience in building positive relationships across all stakeholders.
- demonstrate strong communication and articulation skills.
- provide professional recommendations from direct supervisors and heads of school.
- Possess the ability to be resilient and flexible, creative and innovative.
